To my sisters and brothers in Christ,

## Knox Survey Results ...

Earlier this year, a team of dedicated volunteers led by the Pastoral Care Committee distributed a sheet of questions to help me better understand who you are and where you hope to go.

I was very impressed by the responses – over sixty question sheets were returned. You may have noticed some action has already been taken. Other future planning has been initiated because of your valued input. A common theme is how much you value and love Knox United. You called Knox: God's human presence in community, an extended family, a place for support, comfort, spiritual guidance, renewal, nourishment, growth, fellowship, meaning, tradition, safety, rest, grounding, self-connection, a building open to anyone, the centre of the community. The questions confirmed that you want Knox to be a place to learn and understand Jesus' message and what it means to our everyday lives, and that ultimately the Church is *the people*. Some of the areas of concern that we have already addressed because of your responses: we have removed the "Passing of the Peace," held a Lenten Bible study, installed a white board to improve communications and to make it easier to volunteer for tasks, increased youth participation in worship and have invited youth representatives to serve on church committees, and improved communication regarding collection plates for special services and for PAR.

Some areas of focus for the fall include: increasing outreach both locally and globally, assessing the possibility of opening a thrift store / help centre / food bank in the church, making the sanctuary more welcoming to children and young families, increasing youth participation in worship, improving seating comfort, increasing variety of worship and group gatherings outside of Sunday mornings, becoming more welcoming and inclusive, assessing the possibilities for the future of the back lot (including looking at seniors' housing, a community garden, a labyrinth, a paved parking lot), increasing cooperation with the Baptist church, providing regular financial reports, making better use of technology (including retracting the screen when not in use), continuing the work with the youth group, and improving ministry and visitation to seniors. We heard that you are passionate about and appreciative of our worship music, with many suggestions that were not always in agreement (some asked for more old favourites, while others expressed enjoying the current balance).


There are many ways that your responses have helped, but one of the many things we learned is that we need to be more creative about including new people in volunteer efforts. Some said they would like to help, but don't know how or haven't been asked. We will need your continued patience as we learn how to be more open and inviting – we want to make it easy and rewarding to volunteer at Knox. You are Christ's Body – you are the hands and feet of God in this place!

I was particularly impressed by how good you feel about Knox – the positive feedback was overwhelming, and the vast majority of the responses were very optimistic and complimentary. You are open to change, appreciative of the many dedicated volunteers, and you are happy to see increased youth involvement. Let's live out new stories at Knox United as we live into God's vision of goodness, generosity, hope and love here on earth!
