Message from the Minister

Dear Friends,

I think my favourite season is spring, I love watching the earth come to life after the long winter. It reminds me that when things seem at their worst, and most desolate, there is still the hope of new life, and second chances. However, we need not wait until spring to live into the new life we have been given, because each moment is a new opportunity for a fresh start.

In some ways the United Church of Canada is attempting a fresh (ish) start. At the end of this year Presbyteries and Conferences will cease to exist, and will be replaced by Regions. There will be 16 Regions in the UCC. Our Region will consist of the Pastoral Charges in Nova Scotia, and Bermuda Synod. All Pastoral Charges in New Brunswick, Prince Edward Island, along with Gaspé-Cap-Aux-Os Pastoral Charge, New Carlisle Pastoral Charge, and New Richmond Pastoral Charge, Quebec will be grouped together as another Region. Newfoundland and Labrador will be its own Region.

Together these three regions will share an Executive Minister. Our new Executive Minister will be Faith March-MacCuish, formerly Conference Executive Secretary of Newfoundland and Labrador Conference. There is also the possibility of Pastoral Charges in close proximity forming informal clusters around common interests. While both Maritime Conference, and Truro Presbytery are Affirming Ministries, this designation will not carry over to the new Region. Since the Region is a new body, if it wishes to become an Affirming Ministry, it will have to begin a new process.

The intent of this reorganization is to cut bureaucracy, time will tell if the intent comes to fruition. I have told you before that I do not like change, that remains true. However, I am willing to trust that the Spirit will be with us as the Church attempts to do a new thing. I am also mindful that Christ will continue to be with us as together we seek to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God. Let us pray for new life.
