In worship our church family connects more fully with one another, and our life together is strengthened. Our spirits connect with God's spirit as we worship and our spiritual being is nurtured and fed. We are uplifted and empowered to be what God would have us be and do in our time and place.

This newsletter contains information of special services and other fall events that will enhance our communal life. I hope you will join us in our worship and our work.
