#### Proud to Bee a 4-H'er

4-H Canada has launched a national campaign to encourage insect pollination. Through this initiative, every 4-H member in Canada will receive seed packets containing a bee pollinator mix and be encouraged to plant and grow a pollinator-friendly garden at home or in their community. Not only will **Proud to Bee a 4-H'er** stimulate active outdoor activities, it will allow youth to learn about the essential role that pollinators play in creating a healthy ecosystem and a sustainable food supply.

At least one third of the human food supply from crops and plants depends on insect pollination, most of which is done by bees. At the same time, it is widely recognized that bee health is affected by a variety of interdependent factors including biodiversity and habitat.
