

Message from the Minister . . .

Friends,

What's your favourite season? I have always loved spring. The driving is better, the weather is warmer (but not too warm), and there's no snow to shovel. I love watching the earth return to life, the longer days, and new growth at this time of year. Renewal is the theme of spring as God's world unthaws and begins to move.

Like the earth emerging from winter, I'm also hopeful that our church will be renewed as we emerge from the long Covid winter. But if that is to happen we need people to help carry out God's ministry in the world. We have many positions that remain unfilled.

Maybe you're wondering, "What can I do? My health or mobility isn't the best, so what can I do?" You can do the most important foundational task of our ministry, you can pray for our pastoral charge. You are a part of the Body of Christ and Christ has given you gifts and talents to offer. You are indispensable. You are needed. We all have interdependent roles in the Body of Christ, as Paul writes in the 12th chapter of his first letter to the Corinthians: There is one body, but it has many parts. But all its many parts make up one body. It is the same with Christ. We were all baptized by one Holy Spirit. And so we are formed into one body. It didn't matter whether we were Jews or Gentiles, enslaved or free. We were all given the same Spirit to drink. So the body is not made up of just one part. It has many parts. Suppose the foot says, "I am not a hand. So I don't belong to the body." By saying this, it cannot stop being part of the body. And suppose the ear says, "I am not an eye. So I don't belong to the body." By saying this, it cannot stop being part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, how could it hear? If the whole body were an ear, how could it smell? God has placed each part in the body just as he wanted it to be. 19 If all the parts were the same, how could there be a body? As it is, there are many parts. But there is only one body. The eye can't say to the hand, "I don't need you!" The head can't say to the feet, "I don't need you!" In fact, it is just the opposite. The parts of the body that seem to be weaker are the ones we can't do without. 1 Corinthians 12: 12-27

If you would like explore where your skills and gifts are needed, I'd welcome a discussion. You can call, send a text, email, make an appointment or drop in during office hours. Because of the nature of ministry sometimes scheduled office hours need to be adjusted. I plan on being in the office at Knox Monday, Wednesday and Thursday - Wednesday and Thursday from 9-12, and on Mondays office hours will alternate between mornings and afternoons. From 10-12 on week 1 and from 1-4 on week 2. Office hours at Middle will be on most Tuesdays from 10-12.

Sometimes we think that we're not needed and that someone we feel is more talented than us will surely volunteer. But I'm reminded of the quote by Lily Tomlin, "I always thought someone should do something about that ... then I realized I am somebody"

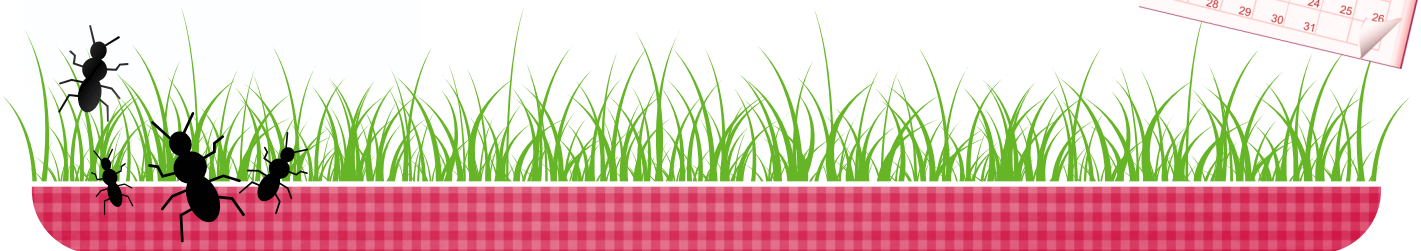

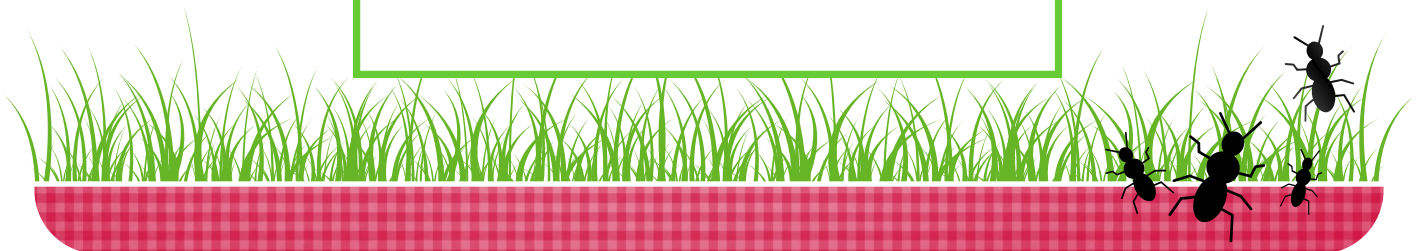
