Greetings Friends,

I've always liked the banjo, so this year I decided to take lessons. I hadn't taken any kind of music lessons since piano when I was in grade six, so there is a lot to learn. I didn't realize that what I don't know about music and learning can feel a bit overwhelming at times. I'm not very good at playing yet, but I'm not disappointed, because I know that if I put in the work, I will get better over time. If I'm terrible at playing banjo today, I at least know that I will be less terrible tomorrow. This is also the approach I took to learning Gaelic, because being bad at something is the first step to being good at something.

I think that's a lesson that is also applicable to life in the church. Sometimes when we try something new we don't give it enough time to take root and grow, and instead quit when it doesn't immediately pan out. Then if we consider trying something similar later on, we remember how it went the first time, and are tempted to stop before we start. But the first step in trying something new is to try it, knowing that it won't be smooth sailing at first, that the first step to being good at something is to be bad at it. I believe we need to keep on putting in the work of being Christ's body in the world, of learning, growing and evolving as disciples, of trying new things, and when we do, we need to give those things adequate space to breathe and grow. We also need to remember that the Church is not called to be perfect, we are called to be faithful.

I am thankful to be growing and walking alongside you in the way of Jesus.

I also want to acknowledge and thank all those who help with lawn care, who keep the kitchen in good working order, and to those who do all the 'behind the scenes' things that not many of us know about! We are blessed to have so many helping hands at Knox.

Knox United continues to offer mission and outreach activities, for the young and old, which our community has come to enjoy and rely on. We have a strong and dedicated group of volunteers that keep Nox Nook, Heather's Heart to Home meals, youth and adult pickle ball (just to name a few!) going. Also, the UCW units and members of the Pastoral Care Committee, who support and organize events and functions are all important in the work of the church.

Fundraising at Knox . . .

Over the past year the fundraising committee has coordinated several successful fundraising events. However, it is important to state that the success of these events was dependent on the volunteer efforts of many. Each event requires a 'small army' to organize, prepare for and carry through to completion. As each event is announced, several are asked and many others come forward to offer their time and talents. A sincere 'Thank you' to each and every one of you.

I think it is also important to say that, while these events have raised more than \$11,500 to support the operational needs of our church, they are more than fundraisers; they are community building and provide opportunities for connections among and between members of our Knox community and the greater Brookfield and area community.

A breakdown of fundraisers thus far in 2023 and profit realized is as follows: Valentine's Extravaganza and Silent Auction (\$4,265.69); Homemade Goodies basket (\$752.00); Catering to Judy & Hugh Matheson anniversary luncheon (\$746.66); Strawberry, Ham and Potato Salad supper (\$2,125.56); Giant Yard Sale and Breakfast (\$3,680.92); Ovenless Turkey Dinner (\$1,095.00) for a total of \$11,570.83!

Plans for the balance of 2023 and into 2024 include the sale of tickets on a Christmas Homemade Goodies basket. Tickets will be available shortly at Nox Nook, the church office, MacQuarries, Roop's Esso, and from Fundraising committee members—1 for \$2 / 3 for \$5. The draw will take place at Nox Nook on Monday, December 18. Also, we will be selling coffee, hot chocolate and cookies during intermission at the Fiddles & Feet concert on December 16th.

Looking forward to 2024, watch for an announcement of the date for the Valentine's Extravaganza, including a silent auction with a whole array of items on which to place bids. It is an exciting evening with great music and delicious appetizers and desserts.

Again, many thanks to those who volunteer their time to work on fundraising events and to those who support these events with your attendance.
